A Top Ten List of Important Dental Health Facts!

- 1. Dogs and cats do not react to oral pain the way that humans do: They can have broken, worn or infected teeth and it doesn't slow them down. Waiting for your pet to show pain can lead to such severe infection that dental treatment becomes an emergency.
- 2. Healthy teeth and gums equal better breath! Dog and cat kisses and snuggles are way more fun with no stinky breath.
- 3. **Dental inflammation can stress the heart, liver, kidneys, and pancreas.** Periodontal disease, inflammation of the support structures around the teeth and associated bacterial infection put constant strain on the organs of the body that keep us healthy. Dental-related bacteria can infect heart valves and lead to heart murmurs and congestive heart failure. Insulin resistance, a step on the way toward Diabetes, has also been linked to oral bacteria.
- 4. Being familiar with the normal environment in your pet's mouth can help you spot abnormalities early. Knowing the color of your pet's gums may help you spot anemia or bruising. Growths or swellings that may not be seen from outside will be detected sooner and be easier to treat if you brush your pet's teeth. We can plan how we will approach a broken tooth if it is found before infection, saving your pet pain and saving you money.
- 5. We need home dental care to keep our mouths healthy- our pets are no different. Consider what our dogs and cats put into their mouths; I rest my case. On a more serious note, gum disease, also called periodontal disease, happens five times more often in dogs than in people. Dogs have a more alkaline mouth than humans, which promotes rapid plaque formation. Approximately two thirds of cats over three years of age have some degree of periodontal disease.
- 6. Many toys and chews that are widely available for pets cause dental problems: Deer antlers and hard bones last a long time and thus are popular chew toys for dogs. Unfortunately, the crowns of a dog or cat's teeth are not as strong as human crowns and can break easily when they encounter very hard objects. The ideal dental chew or toy is

one that you can make a dent in when pressing with your fingernail. When harder toys and treats are used, teeth fracture, causing pain and infection.

- 7. **Dental home care saves you money**! This was mentioned above but is worth saying again. A home dental care routine allows you to find problems in your pet's mouth before they develop into an emergency, giving us time to develop a treatment plan that works for you, your pet and your budget. In many pets, home care can decrease the frequency of dental cleanings.
- 8. Teeth fun facts! Adult cats have 30 teeth, while adult dogs have 42. Adult humans have 32. A Labrador Retriever has the same number of teeth as a Chihuahua.
- 9. The Veterinary Oral Health Council has developed a list of products that have been proven to decrease tartar and plaque accumulation in pets. 




Dogs Corner
