ACUPUNCTURE BENEFITS SURGERY PATIENTS!

We are excited to offer acupuncture treatment for your pet on the day of surgery. Several points can be used to aid in surgical recovery and comfort. The point selection will depend on your pet's constitution, the patient's response to surgery and analgesics and the procedure being performed. The treatment involves placement of a very small sterile needle through the skin and is a very safe adjunct to our sedation, anti-emetic and analgesic protocols.

LV-3: This point, located between the 2nd and 3rd metatarsal bones, improves the flow of energy through the body and helps to decrease stagnation (pain).

PC-6 This point on the front leg is instrumental in addressing nausea and movement of energy in the body. Stimulation may hasten anesthetic recovery.

Scale (Tian-ping): Located on the dorsal midline between T13-L1, this point can be helpful in stopping hemorrhage when used either pre- or post-operatively.

An-Shen: Located behind the ear, this point, when injected with a small amount of B12 vitamin, can help calm anxious patients and ease their recovery.

ST-36: The Master point for the gastrointestinal tract and a key point in the movement of Qi (energy) throughout the body, this point can be used to help normalize appetite after sedation and also address pain.

Nao-shu: Brain stimulation point: This point is located in the temporal fossa and helps to hasten anesthetic recovery.

This is a wonderful addition to your surgical treatment protocol!


