Pet Insurance, Dedicated Credit Card, CareCredit or Savings Account Can Provide Financial Assistance with Unexpected Events Written by Wanda Hudgins, LVT, CVPM, CCFP

Pet Insurance is available for pet owners to help assist them in paying for their pet's veterinary care. It can be helpful with unexpected illnesses, accidents and emergencies. Pet insurance policies not only cover illnesses, accidents, and emergencies, some will even cover wellness visits.

With our fur babies, we may or may not have the funds available to pay for their unexpected medical events. Also, we might like to have some assistance in paying the vet bills.

All insurance policies vary on what items will be covered under their plans (i.e. waiting periods, chronic conditions or pre-existing conditions.) The best advice is to speak with the insurance companies directly and take note of what they do and do not cover, and compare costs. This can be done on an excel spreadsheet for ease of comparison.

Questions to ask regarding coverage:

What counts as a pre-existing condition?

Do some chronic conditions become pre-existing when a new policy term begins?

What, if any, is their waiting period?

If the pet is injured or becomes sick, will this become a pre-existing condition or will it be covered? What is their monthly premium?

Is there a deductible, if so, is it per incident or per year?

What is the reimbursement level or co-pay percentage?

Some of the most common pet insurance companies are: ASPCA, FIGO, Nationwide, Trupanion, Embrace and Pumpkin.

To file a claim, you will pay the animal hospital directly, then submit the claim, with the copy of the invoice from the vet visit, to your insurance carrier. The insurance carrier will pay you directly for the items that are covered.

If pet insurance is not the right path for you, you might consider a separate savings account specifically for your pet(s). Some savings accounts may also accrue interest throughout the year, an additional bonus. Starting at the time you obtain your fur baby and contributing monthly to a savings account can add up and provide a nice financial cushion for those unexpected events.

Another option is CareCredit, which is a health and wellness credit card for both humans and your fur babies. It also works as a type of payment plan where you have 6 months or more to pay it off without interest, depending on the total amount due and provider's plan. It has a higher interest rate, so the recommendation is to pay it off prior to the 6 months to avoid interest. Another option is to set aside a dedicated credit card, which might carry a smaller interest rate, for your pet's needs.

Pet Insurance, a personal savings account, a dedicated credit card or CareCredit, can be a nice addition in covering the cost of your pet's medical care. It is comforting to know that when something unexpected happens to your pet(s), you are prepared and can focus on your pet's care, and giving much needed hugs and kisses.

April is National Heartworm Awareness Month. Heartworm diseasae is caused by the parasitic worm Dirofilaria immitis which is transmitted by mosquitos. In dogs, it affects the circulatory and respiratory systems. It can start with a mild persistent cough and reluctance to exercise and can progress to heart failure. Yearly blood tests and monthly heartworm prevention helps keep your pets safe year round.

When you reschedule or cancel **more than 24 hours** in advance, it allows other patients to be seen in your rescheduled/canceled spot. This ensures the best opportunity for care for all of our patients.
